
TOP 5 REASONS TO PLAY THIS SYSTEM

- 1. 2/1 makes it much easier to explore options when both players have strong hands.
- 2. This is a natural system that is very similar (but far superior) to standard methods.
- 3. Most duplicate players are playing this system, so knowing how to play this will increase your partnership opportunities dramatically.
- 4. Knowing these methods will also help you defend against them when your opponents are bidding. (see number 3)
- 5. Provides a rock solid base for building a more robust system in the future.



2/1 GAME FORCING

We start by showing our 13+ total points and we will support spades next.



13+ points - 4+ diamonds

Note we can **NOT** bid **2H** with this hand because that would show 5+ hearts.



We have a game forcing hand and a major suit fit already.

Game Force and raise hearts next.



Shape should dictate your responses. When we later game force with this hand we will be showing **5+Spades**.


When we have a 9 card major suit fit and game forcing values we use this always!



Sometimes we just have odd hands that don't have a clear bid. We know we are supporting spades next so 2C is a means to an end.



4 – 4 is better than 5 – 3! When we have two fits, it's a strong position. We slow down to show non minimums.



Don't get distracted by shiny side suits. Show your Major Suit fit as soon as you can!



Sometimes you just have to keep making natural bids to get partner to choose or pattern out further.



It's a good idea to grab NT from our side of the table with this semi-balanced hand with good stoppers.



No need to show your heart suit, or to jump. Just show your ability to play No-Trump and see what partner does.






GENERAL CONCEPTS

The principle of fast arrival.

- Slow down with your extra values.
- Speed up with your minimum hands.
- BOTH PLAYERS ARE ADHERING TO THIS!

Show your shape.

- Show your secondary suits quickly or reveal balanced shape, without a fit, by bidding no-trump.
- Establish your fits (especially in the majors) as quickly as possible.
- You will have an opportunity to show any extra values later in the auction.
 Shape is the most important initially.

Step 1 – Find your Strain (suit fit or NT).Step 2 – Determine if Slam is possible.

When we play 2/1 as a game forcing bid, we must use 1NT as our response with some unbalanced hands like these.



SPECIAL USE

With some really bad 3 card raises, we can go through the 1NT forcing sequence first.



When you bid 1NT over 1H, you are always denying a 4 card spades suit! Don't miss this one ©



Don't forget to evaluate your hand properly once you've found a fit in a suit.

FEWER THAN 6 POINTS

We do not always need 6 points to respond to an opening bid by partner. The expert treatment (particularly when non-vulnerable) is to be somewhat aggressive with our responses when we feel we can improve our situation.

Bidding with these types of hands can also be somewhat preemptive to our opponents.

Sometimes partner will make a rebid we don't love, but we will also improve our situation quite often by making one response and then letting it go after a rebid from partner.

"THE BAD RAISE"


The modern method for the direct raise of partner's major (i.e. 1S - 2S) is to play this as a constructive raise. (good 7 - 10).

This is an improvement over our standard methods (single raise = 6 - 10) because it provides a bit more specificity to our raising structure.

With these "bad raises" we start with 1NT and then correct to 2 of partner's major on our next bid.

This method can also serve as another way to preempt the opponents. They are less likely to balance or enter the auction when they think we may not have a fit.





"THE BAD RAISE" STEP 2







THE 3 CARD LIMIT RAISE

These hands can not be shown with one direct bid. So, we must take two steps to show these invitational hands with 3 card spade support to partner.

Step one is to bid 1N (semi –forcing now) and then, if given the opportunity, jump to the 3 level of partner's major with our next bid.

THE 3 CARD LIMIT RAISE FOLLOW UPS

The classic. Just jump to 3 of partner's major to show this invitational raise with 3 card support.

THE 3 CARD LIMIT RAISE FOLLOW UPS

After partner rebids their major suit (always showing 6 cards or longer), our invitational hand becomes much stronger. So, when we see this rebid we jump to game instead of just bidding 3S.





THE 3 CARD LIMIT RAISE FOLLOW UPS

Sometimes our partner will have a very strong hand and make a jump shift in response to our 1NT bid. In these situations, we have to clarify to partner that our hand is more than a preference for spades. Jumping to 4S now will show this hand to partner.








DO NOT BYPASS SPADES


When partner opens 1H, we should not bypass our 4 card spade suit to bid 1NT. Remember, the 1S response is still forcing so we will always have another bid on these auctions. Show your hand naturally and maybe you can find an even better fit with partner in these situations.


TAKING A PREFERENCE

With 2 of partner's major and 4 of partner's minor suit response;

ALWAYS PREFER THE MAJOR SUIT

Partner may only have 3 cards of that minor suit response to our forcing 1NT bid.

THE COURTESY RAISE

COVER FOR PARTNER'S RANGE

When opener rebids a new suit, their range is quite wide (11 – 18). They can't jump shift without their best hands so, with certain strengths, we owe it to them to give them a courtesy raise if we think we could have game opposite their potential higher point totals.

"It's always nice to show partner the proper courtesy"

THE IMPOSSIBLE 2 SPADE BID *ADVANCED*

We all know that we will not bypass a 4 card spade suit to bid 1NT (forcing or semi-forcing). So, we get to use this understanding to our advantage in certain situations.

The 2 Spade bid, after partner rebids a minor suit, will show our best hand with a fit in the minor suit that partner just bid.

This is a terrific agreement to have because now we can differentiate this call from a courtesy raise to 3 of the minor suit directly.







After making the 1NT forcing response, the responder can sign off (show a bad hand and 6+ in the suit) by bidding a new suit at the lowest available level.

OPENER 1ST RESPONSE TO 1NT



THIS IS WHY WE PLAY THE 1NT RESPONSE AS SEMI – FORCING

If we were playing the 1NT response as forcing, we would be forced to bid 2C with this hand. Now we get to pass 1NT with a great hand for that contract.

We risk playing 1NT when partner has a 3 card limit raise or some unbalanced hand that had to bid 1NT but, on average, these are rare occurrences.

No system is perfect but, our gains with this treatment far outweigh our potential losses.

We can pass when;

We do not have a 4 card side suit and when we have a minimum opening hand.





WEAK 6 – 4? REBID YOUR MAJOR SUIT

This is a good general rule to follow. When you are relatively weak, it is best to rebid your major.

This treatment has several advantages with the main one being that major suits will achieve higher scores than minor suits (great for matchpoints scoring).





GOOD 6 - 4?

REBID YOUR 4 CARD SUIT & THEN BID AGAIN (IF POSS)

This is a different situation than a weak 6-4. Many times, we will have another call after this. We will use this extra call (if available) to show our extra values.



Now the stage is set for you to show your extra values by making another call.

When we take this extra call (after partner's clear sign off), they will know we are showing extra values and have this shape.





ALWAYS SHOW HEARTS

ALWAYS

Whenever we are 6 – 4 (spades – hearts) we rebid 2H!
We are way more likely to find a fit in hearts and will
almost never be able to recover if we do not advertise
our shape in this way!

We're OK (usually) missing a minor suit fit when we have a 6 card major. We are not OK when we miss a good major suit fit when we have one!



















SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCE
